# **This Weeks Activity Suggestion:**

# Kim's Game:

This is an easy memory game that the whole family can get involved with and doesn't require many specific items in order to play. Memory and the ability to form and retrieve memories are very important in our early development. It's also a great game to develop the skill of sharing and taking turns.

### You will need:

A tray

A tea towel

Several different small objects that will fit on the tray

### To Play:

- \* Place the chosen objects on the tray (Usually about 8 to 10 objects, but you can start with less and gradually increase the number of objects as you go along should you wish, you might want there to be more objects if your children are older and less if you are playing with younger children).
- \* Set yourselves a certain amount of time (Maybe 1 or 2 minutes) to study the items and to try to remember whats on the tray.
- \* Whoever is running the game (You can swop roles from one game to the next) will then place the tea towl or cloth over the tray so all the objects are covered, and then whilst the tray is covered remove an object from the tray without the other players seeing (it might help to turn your back on the other players whilst doing this, or even leave the room to do this if possible).
- \* Remove the tea towel and the nominated player for the game must guess the item that has been removed. You can then award points if they have guessed the item correctly and keep score.
- \* Restart the process (Using the same objects) but swopping roles ....


